Convention 2017

Saturday, our morning commenced with delegates discussing Union solidarity and fighting the rise of fascism. Saturday afternoon, Patty Clancy facilitated a workshop prepared by the Canadian Labour Congress and its affiliates which introduced delegates to the issue of domestic violence and how it impacts the workplace. Saturday evening, the night was dedicated to honouring Liz Fong, wishing her a happy and healthy retirement! Delegates enjoyed a delicious dinner which was followed by some entertainment. We were entertained by the hilarious, Martha Chavez and then the lights were dimmed, the DJ turned up the music and we danced the night away. He challenged the delegation to think about what Canada's 150th anniversary means for Indigenous communities as well as how we as non-Indigenous Canadians benefit from the oppression of Indigenous communities.

Resolutions passed

It is at Convention that members discuss and vote on any proposed amendments to COPE Local 343's Constitution and By-laws. It is also through resolutions that members develop policy for the Local and provide direction to the Executive Board.

At the April 2017 Convention, the delegates discussed and adopted six (6) resolutions. The following resolutions are of note. The Local has sent the constitutional amendment to COPE National for approval. It has also implemented the resolutions through revisions to its Policy and Procedures Guidelines and the Local's Expense Form. Once finalized, you will be able to find all of these documents on Local 343's web site.

Constitution and By-laws

Article 12 – Delegate Entitlement - increasing Youth participation

Each Bargaining Unit and the General Unit will be entitled to have a Youth Member attend the AGM, Convention and Special Convention as a delegate. If necessary, the Youth Member will be elected.

In addition, the Local will have five (5) Youth Member delegates attend its AGM, Convention and Special Convention. The Elections Committee will determine a process for selecting these five (5) delegates from the Local's membership.

Policies and Procedures

Child and Dependent Care Policy - removing barriers to participation

When licensed on-site childcare is not available at a Local 343 function, Local 343 will reimburse a member's daycare or childcare costs up to \$75 per child per day.

Local 343 will also reimburse the member's dependent care costs up to \$75 per family member per day when attending a Local 343 function.

When an Executive Board member incurs child or dependent care costs in excess of their regular costs to attend a Local 343 Executive Board or committee meeting, or an event in an official capacity, Local 343 will reimburse these expenses in the amount of \$75 per occasion.

Direction

Fall School - empowerment through education

The Local will pursue the creation of a 'Fall School' to provide members with additional educational opportunities.

COPE Local 343 Scholarship



COPE Local 343 has an annual scholarship fund in the amount of \$3000. This fund is to help off-set the costs for members and their children who have been accepted at

or are enrolled in post-secondary education, including but not limited to trade schools, colleges, universities and professional designations. A scholarship recipient may re-apply. Should there be more successful applicants than awards available, priority will be given to applicants who have not received a scholarship previously.

As part of the application process, applicants are required to submit an essay (500-750 words) or submit a work of art (illustration, painting, song, etc.) and description of the piece that is in-line with the topic/theme that will be provided by the Local. Essays and works of art should not be marked with an applicant's name. This is to ensure that every applicant has a fair, unbiased evaluation conducted of their application.

It is time to have the conversation about mental health and illness in Ontario workplaces. Mental

illness is considered the number one cause of workplace disability in Canada, yet stigma against those suffering from mental illness is still a reality. That stigma is a key reason why many Ontarians don't talk about mental illness in their



workplaces. Starting May 6 in Toronto,
Prevention Link will launch a series of mental
health workshops aimed at opening the
conversation around mental health challenges in
workplaces across Ontario. The half-day
workshop, which will be offered in Sudbury,
London and Ottawa, will enable participants to
learn about and talk more openly about mental
